

RPHL NETWORK: ADVANCING PARTNERSHIP

FOR CAPACITY BUILDING ON LABORATORY SYSTEMS

15-17 MAY 2023, MIRACLE GRAND, BANGKOK, Thailand

The Thai government through the Department of Medical Sciences will host a partnership forum of the Regional Public Health Laboratory Network aiming for:

- 1) Sharing progress/update of the network
- 2) Presenting preliminary report of 'Situational Assessment' for capacity building of the Network
- 3) Identifying collaboration for capacity building of the Network and 'Flagship Program/initiatives' of the Network
- 4) Reviewing and setting the directions of the network

Background

In October 2019, Thailand, the Department of Medical Sciences (DMSc), Ministry of Public Health works closely with countries and key development partners in establishing the 'Regional Public Health Laboratory (RPHL) Network' under the Global Health Security Agenda [GHSA], funded by USAID through FHI 360.

The Network was successfully formed and has functioned well with initial focuses on sharing information, knowledge, and resources among human health regional public health laboratories. The network currently consists of 12 country members, including 11 countries in ASEAN and Nepal.

During its annual forum in December 2020, the Network was well acknowledged as one of regional responsive mechanisms, especially during COVID-19 pandemic. key recommendations to sustain the network were deliberated include: **Building Trust, Visibility/Communication/Coordination, Governance/Structure, and Resource Mobilization.**

In October 2022, visioning to be one of '**RESPONSIVE**' lab networks in Asia and Pacific, the 3-year Strategic Work Plan [2023 – 2026] has been crafted/concurred by the network with four keys strategic objectives including:

- I. Strengthen the foundation of secretariat,
- II. Facilitate capacity building,
- III. Strengthen the network/ coordinating platform, and
- IV. Enhance knowledge management platform.

During December 2022 – March 2023, the Situational Assessment for capacity development plan has been undertaken in collaboration with key development partners such as CHAI, FIND, WHO SEARO, and CDC.

To materialize the key strategic objectives and its development above, it deems necessary to hold an annual partnership forum to advance partnership and synergy efforts with key development partners, especially in addressing the gaps transpiring from this exercise. Among others, it is expecting that the plan for building capacity of laboratory systems for the Network will be jointly developed.

This event will be conducted during **15-17 May 2023** preceding the two following RPHL Network events:

- a) An annual meeting for RPHL Network on **17 May 2023**; and
- b) Regional Infectious Substance Shipping Program and Standard Operating Procedure Development on **17-19 May 2023**.

The Annual Partnership Forum is supported by FIND and DTRA in collaboration with the Thai government through the Department of Medical Sciences with expecting of 70-100 participants representing national laboratories from 12 countries in Asia and Pacific, lab experts, key development partners, regional lab networks, regional entities/networks, and GHSA Chair, coordinating bodies & relevant Action Packages/Task Forces.

Participants: about 70 - 100 of participants [in country & international]

- e) Enhanced lab networks and gained visibility of RPHL Network
